Culturally relevant teaching is instruction that takes into account students' cultural differences. Although examples of culturally relevant teaching programs exist, implementing it can be challenging. Making education culturally relevant is thought to improve academic achievement, but understandings of the construct have developed over time. Key characteristics and principles define the term, and research has allowed for the development and sharing of guidelines and associated teaching practices.
