Christmas operas are operas which are thematically based on either the Nativity of Jesus or secular Christmas stories. Because of the ban on secular theatrical works during the season of Advent, these early Christmas operas, while elaborately staged, were based on religious themes relating to the Nativity. The earliest Christmas operas appeared in the early 17th century, not long after the creation of the art form. By the mid 19th century the ban on secular operas during Advent had ceased, and operas based on a wider array of Christmas themes, such as Santa Claus and King Wenceslaus, emerged 0464dd4a1a
