Hirsch is best known for his 1987 book Cultural Literacy, which was a national best-seller and a catalyst for the standards movement in American education. Cultural Literacy included a list of approximately 5,000 "names, phrases, dates, and concepts every American should know" in order to be "culturally literate." Hirsch's arguments for cultural literacy and the contents of the list were controversial and widely debated in the late 1980s and early '90s. bceea185c3

Readers and texts are assigned a Lexile score, where lower scores reflect easier readability for texts and lower reading ability for readers. Thus, Lexile scores do not reflect multiple levels of textual meaning or the maturity of the content. content. S. Lexile scores are assigned based on individual words and sentence length, rather than qualitative analysis of the content.
