AIAG / VDA FMEA handbook (2019) the RPN approach was replaced by the AP (action priority) in the Supplemental FMEA for Monitoring and System Response Failure mode and effects analysis (FMEA; often written with "failure modes" in plural) is the process of reviewing as many components, assemblies, and subsystems as possible to identify potential failure modes in a system and their causes and effects. For each component, the failure modes and their resulting effects on the rest of the system are recorded in a specific FMEA worksheet. Related methods combine mathematical failure rate models with a statistical failure mode ratio databases a685d69b36
