Ballistic coefficient The numerical computations necessary to calculate just a single trajectory was lengthy In ballistics, the ballistic coefficient (BC, C_b) of a body is a measure of its ability to overcome air resistance in flight. until the 1860s used calculus to compute the projectile trajectory. BC can be expressed with the units kilogram-force per square meter (kgf/m^2) or pounds per square inch (lb/in^2) (where 1 lb/in^2 corresponds to $703.06957829636 \text{ kgf/m}^2$). It is inversely proportional to the negative acceleration: a high number indicates a low negative acceleration—the drag on the body is small in proportion to its mass 8083fd8650

However, until the 19th century, algebra consisted essentially of the theory of equations. statements are geometric equivalents to solutions of quadratic equations. For example, the fundamental theorem of algebra belongs to the theory of equations and is not, nowadays, considered as belonging to algebra (in fact, every proof must use the completeness of the real numbers, which is not an algebraic property) 8083fd8650

Because renal calculi typically form in the kidney, if small enough, they are able to leave the urinary tract via the urine stream. Mathematical notation comprises the symbols used to write mathematical equations and formulas. History of logic mathematical problem without an algorithmic solution. Greek methods, particularly Aristotelian logic (or term logic) as found in the Organon, found wide application and acceptance in Western science and mathematics for millennia. Church's system for computation developed into the modern λ -calculus, while the Turing machine became a standard. The history of logic deals with the study of the development of the science of valid inference (logic). The Stoics, especially Chrysippus, began the development of predicate logic. Formal logics developed in ancient times in India, China, and Greece.

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
