Some songs could be considered dance pieces, but there were none of the traditional Bulgars, Freylekhs or Horas. Margot Leverett Leverett later became interested in klezmer, a traditional musical style of the Jews of Eastern Europe. She studied with klezmer clarinetist Sidney Beckerman and was a founding member of The Klezmatics in 1985. Born in Ohio, she lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and Buffalo, New York before studying at Indiana University School of Music. The Klezmatics, a band associated with the Klezmer revival would later become the first klezmer band to win a Grammy Award.
