This approach depends on Vaughan's simplified version of Vinogradov's method for estimating sums over prime numbers (see §24). Vinogradov devised his method in order to estimate the sum $\sum_{p \leq x} e(\alpha p)$; to maintain the historical perspective I have inserted (in §§25, 26) a discussion of this exponential sum and its application to sums of primes, before turning to the large sieve and Bombieri's theorem. With this stimulation, such great progress was made that our current understanding of these topics extends well beyond what was known in 1966
